Will

In the Name of God Amen. I John Clark of the county of Southampton and parish of Northway being sick and weak of body but of perfect mind and sound memory, thanks be to almighty God, do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following Viz. I give and recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God that take it, and my body I do commend to the Earth to be buried in a decent and christially manner at the direction of my Executors. And as for what worldly estate it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give & dispose of the same in manner and form following. Viz.

I give to my children hereafter named Viz. William, James, Mary Anne, Warner, Rebekah, Miley, Richardson, Sally Clark, Judith and to each of them the Sum of Thirty pounds £. 30. pence current money to be raised & levied out of my Estate at the discretion of my Executors viz. at the time of my Sons arriving at the age of twenty one Years and my daughters at the day of marriage to them and their heirs for ever.

I give to my Son James Clark a certain Tract or parcel of Land I bought of Alexander Murray bearing date the eleventh day of July one thousand seven hundred and fifty eight to him and his heirs for ever.

I lend the use of my land and plantation whereon I now live to my wife Rebekah Clark during her natural life or widowhood together with all the personal Estate of what nature or kind soever but in case of her marriage only a child's part. And after my wife's death or marriage I give the above said Land to my Son William Clark on condition that the said William Clark pay to my Son Warner one fourth part of the Value of the said Land.
