- Item I give to my Grandson Lunsford Lundy one Negro boy named Jerry to him & his heirs for ever
- Item I give to my Grandson James Lundy son of my son William Lundy a negro girl named Betty to him and his heirs for ever, but in case he dies before he arrives to twenty one years then I give the said negro to my son William Lundy to him & his heirs for ever.
- Item I give to my son Thomas Lundy or Grandson rather one Negro girl named Chory but if he should die before he arrives at twenty one years, then I give the said negro to my son William Lundy to them and their heirs for ever.
- Item I give to my grandson William Lundy son of my son James Lundy a negro boy named Dunmore, but in case he dies before he arrives to twenty one years then I give the said Boy to my son James Lundy to them and their heirs for ever.
- Item I give to my granddaughter Mary Lundy daughter of my son Isham Lundy one negro named Selby to her and her heirs for ever.
- Item I give to my granddaughter Sarah Lundy daughter of Isham Lundy one negro named Hannah to her and her heirs for ever.
- Item I give to my grand daughter Winneford Lundy daughter of Isham Lundy one Negro girl named Abby to her and her heirs for ever.
- Item I give and bequeath to my four grand children of spring of my son Isham Lundy dead. the following negroes to wit. Roy, Liza & James to be equally divided amongst them with the other Negroes of the said Isham Lundy's Estate and my will and desire is that the above Negroes shall not be hired out to the highest bidder.
- Item I lend to my Sister Elizabeth Hoof during her natural life my old negro Rachel and at her death my desire is that she be set free, and if she should by age or infirmities become so as not to be able to get her living by labour, then my two sons William and James, and my daughter Elizabeth shall maintain her jointly so that she may not suffer.
- Item It is my will and desire that my Negro Jerry be set free, and she is hereby at my death manumitted accordingly with her increase my Exrs shall apply to court for a certificate
- Item My will is that all the residue of my estate not herein mentioned shall be equally divided amongst my three children William Lundy, James Lundy & Elizabeth Lundy and shall not be sold. I give to my son James Lundy the hand mill, large chest, Dutch Oven, carpenters and coopers tools and loom to him and his heirs for ever, my Estate not to be appraised. I do nominate and appoint my sons William Lundy and James Lundy Exrs of this my last will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this first day of May one thousand seven hundred and 83.

This will was proved by the oaths of John Rogers, Solomon Harrison & Thomas Cook three of the witnesses thereto and continued for the Executors to qualify. And at a court held for the said county of Southampton the 13th day of November 1783, on a motion of Wm Lundy and James Lundy the Executors in this will named who made oath according to Law a certificate is granted them for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form giving security & the will was ordered to be recorded.
