This will was presented in Court by Elonor Willons the Executrix therein named and proved by the oath of Thomas Lane one of the witnesses therein who also deposed that he saw Henry Powers the other witness, who is since dead, sign his name thereto at the publishing thereof, and was ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said Executrix who made oath according to law a certificate is granted her for obtaining a Probat thereof in due form giving security. Whereupon &c.

In the name of God. Amen. I William Moore of the county of Southampton and Parish of St. Lukes being in a low state of health but of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit.

I will and direct that all my just debts be paid.
 I direct that whatever Estate remains of whatsoever kind as wheresoever found, except what is hereafter devised be divided into two equal parts, one of which I lend the use of to my Mother Sarah Moore, during her natural life or widowhood, at the expiration of either term I give the said part to be divided equally between my sisters Sarah Garrett, Elizabeth Moore, and Rebekah Moore to them and their heirs for ever.

I give and bequeath to my Brother John Moore the other part of my Estate as above, likewise the best horse I see possessed with together with my Bridle and Saddle to him and his heirs for ever. Wm. Moore
