In the name of God. Amen. I Edmund Spencer of the Parish
 of St. Luke and County of Southampton being sick & weak of body but
 of sound and disposing mind and memory thanks be given to almighty
 God for the same, do make and constitute this my last will and testa-
 ment in forms and manner following. To-wit

I give and bequeath to my two Sons David & William and their
 heirs for ever the plantation whereon I now live & land therunto
 belonging, to be equally divided between them, but if either of my said
 sons should die without heir lawfully begotten of his body my will
 and desire is that the survivor should hold the whole Tenement hereby
 intended to be divided between them to him and his heirs for ever.

Item

I give and bequeath to my Son Gabriel & his heirs for ever the
 plantation whereon he now lives and land therunto belonging, also
 two cows, six head of hogs & two sheep.

Item

I lend to my son in law Nathan Jackson & his wife Sarah the use
 of the land purchased of brother Vick during both their lives
