

Item I lend unto my loving wife Sarah Sumnerell the use of the remainder part of my lands that I have not herein before given during my said wife's widow hood or natural life, but at my said wife's marriage or death I give and bequeath such land before lent to my wife to be equally divided between two of my sons George & Samuel Sumnerell if my said sons George & Samuel Sumnerell should disagree in division respecting such land, it is my will that such land shall be sold to the highest bidder between my two sons George & Samuel only and which of my two sons George or Samuel shall give most for such land shall pay unto the other his proportion Such gift of land I give unto my aforesaid sons George & Samuel and to their heirs for ever. I further give unto my son Samuel one bay Colt

Item I lend the use of my Mill to my wife and children jointly, including the whole of my children during my wife's widow hood or natural life, it is further my will that my mill shall not be removed from the place she now stands at during my said wife's widow hood or life, but at my said wife's marriage or death I give my mill as I shall hereafter mention.

Item I lend the use of my Negro man Cofee together with all my blacksmith's tools the said negro man & tools to be hired out annually and such hire to be annually divided amongst my wife and my eight children, Sandy, Stephen, Elizabeth, John, George, James, Sarah, Samuel & Lucy (wands if my wife should now be with child, it is my will that such child shall inherit together with the rest of my surviving ones respecting such hire proceeding from Negro & tools such hiring of Negro & tools to continue until my wife marries or expires.

Item But on my said wife's marriage or death I give and bequeath such Negro man Cofee & blacksmith's tools together with my Mill to be equally divided amongst my eight surviving children, namely Stephen Sumnerell, Elizabeth Dales, John Sumnerell, George Sumnerell, James Sumnerell, Sarah Sumnerell, Samuel Sumnerell & Lucy Sumnerell together with the child may my wife may be now big with to them and their heirs for ever.

Item The remainder of my Estate let it be of what nature, or kind soever I have such Estate that I have not before given after my just debts are paid I lend the use of such estate if any such shall then remain to my wife Sarah Sumnerell during her widow hood or natural life, but at my said wife's marriage or death I give such remainder of my Estate as before mentioned if any such shall then remain to be equally divided as before devised respecting an equal division amongst the whole of my surviving children together with the one my wife may perhaps be now big with. I do also constitute my sons Stephen Sumnerell and John Sumnerell my whole and sole Executors of this my last will and testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighth day of January One thousand seven hundred and eighty three
