Secondly I give and bequeath to my son Robert Reicks five shillings current money of Virginia to him and his heirs for ever. Thirdly I give and bequeath to my son Richard Reicks all the land which I have leased during lease of the Nansemond Indians together with all which I have possessed him with also one Cow to him his heirs and assigns for ever. Fourthly I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Reicks all which I have already possessed him with to him his heirs and assigns for ever. Fifthly I give & bequeath to my three daughters, Mary Reicks, Melisent Reicks & Ann Reicks all the remainder part of my Estate of what nature soever to them their heirs and assigns for ever.
