The court held for the county of Southampton the 10th day of March 1785. This Inventory & appraisement of the Estate of W^m Piche son of which was this day returned & ordered to be recorded.

Samuel Hindred's Will. In the name of God Amen. I Samuel Hindred being in my perfect sense & memory do make this my last will & testament in manner & form as followeth:

I give & bequeath unto my Son Benjamin Hindred part of the land whereon I now live to be bounded as followeth (to wit) beginning on Moses mounth at Henry Caughan's line, thence down the creek swamp to the mouth of my spring branch, thence up the run of D. Spring branch to the head thereof from thence to the head of the long branch in Henry Caughan's line, thence along Caughan's line to the beginning, and one feather bed & furniture, and two cows and calves, to him and his heirs for ever.

I give and bequeath unto my Son Eliska Hindred after my wives death all my land (except such as I have given my Son Benjamin) and one feather bed and furniture, to him and his heirs for ever.

I devise that the Sum of two thousand pounds may be raised by the sale of such part of my Estate as my Executor hereafter to be mentioned shall think can be best shewed, and when raised I desire that such sum may be put at Interest on the loan Office untill my Son Henry Hindred arrives to the age of twenty one years, at which time I give the said Sum of two thousand pounds & the Interest arising thereon to said Son Henry to him and his heirs for ever.

I lend unto my loving wife Ann Hindred during her natural life all my lands (except such as I have given my Son Benjamin) & the use of my whole Estate after paying my just debts & discharging the legacies that I have given my Son Benjamin & Henry.

I give at my wife's death all my whole Estate (except such as I have already given) both such as I have now in possession and likewise such as I may be intitled to at the death of Sarah Crocker with my four children
