and memory do make & ordain this as for my last will and testament & dis-
pose of my Estate as followeth:

I give to my beloved wife Sarah the use of all my Estate of what-
kind or nature soever for and during her natural life and after her
death my devise is that it may be equally divided amongst my three
sons viz. John, Moses and William & their heirs for ever revoking all
other wills by me made heretofore, & I do constitute and appoint my friend
Joshua Wood Executor of this my last will and testament. In witness
whereof I have set my hand & seal this 29th day of December 1776

memory do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament in
manner and form as followeth.

Imprimis

I give and bequeath to my wife Mary Lancaster my negro woman
Livy to hold to her and her heirs for ever. I also give to my said wife
during her widowhood all the rest and remainder of my Estate that is not
hereafter disposed off in Legacies with liberty to sell or dispose of any part
of my house hold goods or stock for the support of herself and family dur-
ing her widowhood as above. And at her death or marriage my will
is that all my Estate both real and personal may be sold except what
I do give away in Legacies and the money arising from such sale to
be equally divided between my two sons Etheldred and James Lan-
casters after my son James taking & receiving to himself Twenty
pounds cash
