have hereunto set my hand & seal this 24th day of March 1781.

in the county of Southampton being sick & weak but of sound sense & memory
do make my last will & testament as follows.

After my just debts & funeral expenses are paid I give & bequeath to my
beloved wife for & during the term of her natural life & no longer the use
of one hundred & fifty acres of land including the plantation whereon I now
live together with my Negroes Luke & Pat during the same term I also give
to my said wife both my horses Dart & Turlton four cows & calves such as
she may chuse & my whole stock of sheep & hogs and all the provisions laid
up for the present year to her and her heirs for ever.

I give to my said wife all my tools and plantations utensils of every kind
including two pair of cart wheels together with two feather beds, one wal-
nut table, one ironing table, two flat irons & one box iron, three pots such
as she may chuse, one women's saddle & bridle, one flax wheel two roller
wheels, two pair of cards, half a dozen chairs, three pewter dishes &
half a dozen plates all my knives and forks, all my earthen ware of
every kind, one chest and twenty five pounds in specie to be paid her
when my debts can be collected to her & her heirs for ever
