At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 1<sup>th</sup> day of October 1776 This Account Current of the administration of the estate of Wm Westbrook dec<sup>d</sup> was reported and Ordered To be recorded

In the name of God Amen I John Mundell of Southampton County and of St. Lukes Parish being sick and weak but in perfect mind and memory Praise be god for it but knowing the uncertainty of our being here do make this my last will and Testament as followeth

I give and bequeath my soul to God that gave it me Relying on the Merrets of my Blessed Saviour to have full remission of all my sins and my body to be entred to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named

I Give and bequeath to my son John Mundell my land and plantation lying on the south side of the flat swamp containing one hundred & fifty acres more or less to him and his heirs forever also I give him one Negro Girl called Lucy which he hath now in possession with her increase if she should have any to him & his heirs forever I give him two feather beds which he hath in possession

I Give and bequeath to my son Joseph Mundell my land and plantation lying on the North side of the flat swamp containing two hundred acres more or less it being my manner plantation to him and his heirs forever also give him one negro Boy called Tom to him
