

Thomas Prellow of Southampton County being sound in mind & memory
 do hereby make all and every other Will made by me Void and do make & declare
 this to be my last will and Testament as follows: *Witness*

I Give & bequeath of all my Lands with all their appurtenances to my wife Mary
 Prellow During her Life and after her death I Give and Bequeath the whole
 of the same I now Live with all the lands and appurtenances thereunto
 belonging to my Nephew Thomas Prellow son of Joseph Prellow Deceased to him
 and his heirs forever.

I Give and bequeath to my Nephew Benjamin Prellow son of Samuel Prellow
 Deceased the land and plantation I bought of Jonathan Thomas and Catherine in 1780
 acres on the Isle of Wight (Va.) with all the appurtenances thereunto
 belonging to him and his heirs forever but if he should die without
 lawful issue I give the same to Joseph Prellow grandson of Joseph
 Prellow Deceased to him and his heirs forever.

My Will and Desire is that all the Remainder of my Estate of every kind
 and quality Continue and Remain in my wife's possession till she dies
 or Marries and then to sell and the money divided one half as she shall
 direct in her will and the other half as I now direct. *Witness* my fifth
 part among the children of my Brother Joseph Prellow Deceased and one fifth
 part among the children of my Brother Joshua Deceased and one fifth part
 among the children of my Brother Samuel Deceased and one fifth
 part among the children of my sister Mary Deceased and the remaining
 fifth to my Brother John Prellow and his disposing.
 I constitute and appoint Thomas Prellow Junr and Robert Ricks my
 executors to this my last will and Testament as written by my hand and
 seal this Twenty first Day of the 1st Month of March One Thousand Seven
 hundred and Eighty Six Signed Sealed and Delivered in

A Court held for the County of Southampton the 14 day of June 1817
 This Will was presented in Court by Thomas Prellow and Robt. Ricks the
 executors therein named & prior to by the solemn affirmation of James
 Prellow and Mary T. Prellow the subscribers being witnesses thereto as also by
 the affirmations of Saml. Ricks, who deposed that said will was the
 hand writing of the said Thos. Prellow the Testator which is now
 to be recorded and on the motion of the said Executors who affirm according
 to law Certificate is granted them for obtaining a probat thereof in
 due form giving security whereupon &c.
