It is my Will and desire that my Body be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors and my just debts first paid.

I Give unto my beloved wife Mary Blunt the use of my plantation adjoining John Myrick and James Laidys lands also the following Slaves Simon, Sam, Henry, Luke, Lucy now on the said plantation. Also Ann and her Fall also one third of the stock of Cattle, Hogs and Sheep on the said plantation. I further give to my wife forever all the stock of Horses except the Horses which
