do hereby in perfect sense and memory do make this my last Will and Testament
in the manner and form as followeth (to wit)

I give and bequeath to my loving wife Ann Atkinson all my lands lying between
Cassford road and Blunts swamp arising, her natural life also
beds and furniture such as she may choose

I desire that all my personal estate except what I have given my wife
may be sold by my executor hereafter to be mentioned for the purpose of
paying my debts I do further leave a power of Selling all my land on the
other side the red road to the said River I further desire that the land
of it be sold and also my personal estate be sold at nine months and
I desire that after my wifes death that the land I have lent here may be
sold by the executor and the money arising therefrom give to be equal of
divided between my two sons Elias and Elisha Atkinson

I do appoint my friend Benjamin Blunt Executor of this my last
Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and affixed my seal this 25th day of October 1733
