In the name of God Amen I Kindred Jackson of the County of Southampton being in perfect sense and sound memory do this Seventy third day February 1787 make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say.

I give and bequeath to my loving Brother William Jackson my land and plantation whereon I now live containing Eight Acres more or less to him and his heirs forever

I give and bequeath to Jean Brewer Six pounds Six Shillings hard money to her and her heirs forever

I give the Residue of my estate Consisting of one Bay Mare Two cows and Two Charlings and one Bull viz head of sheep and one Gun to be sold by my executors and the money arising to pay my just debts and the Legacy to Jean Brewer and the residue of money if any to be equally divided Betwixt my Loving Brothers John Jackson and William Jackson

I do make constitute and appoint my Uncle John Jackson and my Friend David Edwards my sole and sole Exors of this my last will and testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and year first above Written
