In the name of God Amen I William Barrett
of the County of Southampton being in a poor state of health, think proper
to make his last will and Testament First I bequeath my Soul to God who
gave it me and my Body to the ground to be buried in a Decent manner at
the discretion of my executor and as Touching my worldly Estates which
has pleased Almighty God to bestow to me in this World I do Dispose of in
Manner and form as followeth Item I give and Bequeath unto my son
William Barrett the plantation where I now live to him and his heirs
forever Item I give and Bequeath unto my son Will^{ts} Barrett the
Plantations in Vanseman's County to him and his heirs forever, —
and all the moveable part of my estate I leave to my Children to be equally
divided amongst them at the death of their Mother and I appoint my wife
and my friend Jordan Denson my Executors and executor of this my last
Will and Testament Revoking and disannulling all other to be no Effect as
witness my hand and Seal This day of December 1787.
