

An Inventory of the Estate of Joseph Vasser dec^d July 15th 1732.
 One Old Negro woman Moll Schelders Vasser 3 Cattle 3 Chears
 1 Ball one Gun 2 Dies hoes
 2 Basons 3 Plates &c

A Court held for the County of Southampton the 1st day of July
 1738 This Inventory of the estate of Joseph Vasser deceased
 returned and ordered to be recorded

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Holt of
 Southampton County being in Sound mind and memory do make this my last
 Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth
 Inprimis I give and bequeath to my Son Charles Holt my Negro Boy Louis to
 him and his heirs forever I then I give to my Son Tho^s Holt the plantation
 whereon I now live also my Negro Boy Daniel to him and his heirs forever also one
 Feather Bed and Furniture one Black Walnut Table one Iron pot two cows and
 Piggs one Cow and Calf and five Barrels Corn
 I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Martin my Negro Boy Ransom
 To her and her heirs forever
 I then leave the use of my Negro Woman Judy to my Daughter Sarah Land and during
 her natural life and at her death to be equally divided between my two
 Grand Daughters Rebecca Rawlings and Ann Rawlings with her issues
 them and their heirs forever I also give to my Daughter Sarah Land all my remaining
 one Saw and Piggs and five Barrels of Corn
 I then I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Nancy Rawlings one Feather
 bed and furniture my flax wheel and hatchle
 I then I give and bequeath to Polly Rawlings Daughter Nancy Rawlings my
 Negro Boy Hercules when she comes to the age of Eighteen Years to her
 her heirs forever and in case she should die before she comes to that
 age then her mother to have the said Negro my desire is that her
 mother have the use of said Negro till that time
 I Give and bequeath to my ^{young} Daughter Meason Harby Holt the sum of
 ten pounds
 My desire is that my Negro Woman Hannah may have her liberty
 To live where pleases amongst my Children without controule
