

24th Item I give to my Daughter Sally Britt the use of my Negro Gal Jenny and her increase but not to be in possession untill the death of my wife Ann Jenkins to have and her heirs forever also an feather bed

Item I give to my Daughter Molly Williford the use of my Negro Gal Began and her increase but not to be in possession untill the death of my above mentioned wife to her and her heirs forever also an feather Bed

Item I give to my Daughter Betsy Jenkins my Negro named London and her increase but not to be in possession untill the death of her said wife to her and her heirs forever also an feather Bed

Lastly It is my will and desire that after the Death of my wife that the increase of those Negroes not now particularly mentioned or devised to my children separate from those to her may be equally divided between my two sons Jesse Jenkins and William Jenkins to them and their heirs forever together with their future increase - The remainder of my Estate at the death of my wife Ann Jenkins I desire may be equally divided between my said Children Jesse Jenkins William Jenkins Sally Britt, Molly Williford, and Betsy Jenkins to them and their heirs forever And I do hereby appoint my wife Ann Jenkins Executrix and my two sons Jesse and William Jenkins Executors of this my last Will and Testament and I do hereby revoke and annul all wills by me heretofore made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this 23th day of March and in the Year of our Lord 1789

The Court held for the County of Southampton the 11th day of September 1789 This will was presented in court by Jesse Jenkins one of the executors the others refusing, prayed by the oaths of Hartwell Locke and John Andrews witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of the said executor who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form giving security whereupon &c
