I Richard Morrell of Southampton County being sick and weak of body
Lofsound and disposing mind and memories knowing the uncertainty of this
transitory life do think proper to make my last will and Testament in
manner and form following to wit

First I give to my son Shadrach Morrell one hundred acres of land being one
half of two hundred I bought of Henry Pope and that part where the plantation
now is and five pounds Cash To him and his heirs forever

Secondly I give to my son Richard Morrell The plantation and land whereon
I now live containing one hundred and ninety nine acres also my Still
Pot and worms to him and his heirs forever

Thirdly I give to my son William Morrell one hundred acres of land being the other
part half of the lands bought of Henry Pope now in woods and five
pounds cash To him and his heirs forever

Fourthly I give to my son Matthew Morrell thirty pounds cash
to him and his heirs forever
