In the name of God amen I James Harris of Southampton
County being sick and weak of Body but of sound mind and Memory do make
and ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say

I give and bequeath my Nephew Jacob Harris Son of my Brother Drury
all my Land to him and his heirs forever but in case he should die before he
arrives to the age of Twenty Years then I give the said Land to my Nephew
James Harris Son of my Brother Moses Harris to him and his heirs
forever

I give all the remainder of my Estate of what kind Iever after my Just debts
are paid I give to my Niece Nancy Harris Daughter of my Brother
Drury Harris to her and her heirs forever I do nominate and
appoint my friend John Rogers and James Sandy Executors of this
my last Will and Testament revoking all others heretofore made by
me in writings whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this
Sixteenth day of June one thousand seven hundred and eighty nine

of Oct. 1787 This Will was presented in Court by James
