County living in health of Body and perfect in memory do make this my last Will and
Testament

I have the one half of my Land both Cleared and uncleared to be divided by three
Honest Neighbours to my Wife Mary during of her Natural life and at her death to
my son Benjamin Iny to him and his heirs forever also lent to my wife during
life my Hagersey and Stan Two Feather Beds and Furniture two Cows and
Calves and one Horse that she may have one Half the Plantation Utensils
and house hold and kitchen furniture except the Beds & Jars and Piggs and Six
Year old Hogs

I Give and bequeath to my Son Phillips Iny the other half of my Land to him and
his heirs forever My Will and desire is that at my Wifes death all the Remainder
of my Estate of what Nature or kind so ever longually divided by three Honest Neighbours
between my three Children Benjamin Iny Phillips Iny and Bishop Baps without
Fail the other part not as yet divided I desire at my Death to be equally divided between
my three Children above mentioned

Lastly I constitute and appoint my two sons Benjamin Iny and Phillips
Iny my whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and testament
revoking all others made by me heretofore made In witness whereof
I have here unto set my hand and Seal this Twelfth Day of January
one thousand seven hundred and Eighty seven
