Will and Testament in manner and form following

- Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Simon Murfee my Stone all the Carpenters Tools except the fore and back plane to him his heirs and assigns forever
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Son William Murfee one Gun now in his possession my shaving Razor one fore and back plane to him and his heirs assigns forever
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Molly Murfee Thirty shillings current money of Virginia to her and her heirs forever
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Lucy Daughtrey one Cow and Calf to her and to her heirs and assigns forever
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughters Celia, Sally, and Stacey Murfee eight pounds current money each to them and to their heirs assigns respectively forever
