according to law Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat
thereof in due form.

In the name of God Amen I Samuel Drewry being law
and weak of body but of sound and disposing mind and memory do make under date
this my last Will and Testament revoking all former Wills by me made in manner
and form following (to wit)

First I give and bequeath unto my Son Samuel Drewry all that part of my tract of
Land wheron I now live that is bounded by the afsamoose swamp William
Crichlow line aline of marked trees to another line of William Crichlows
bought of Joel Wood by said Crichlow line to the main road to Joel Woods
line and by the said Woods line to the afsamoose swamp supposed to contain
two hundred acres more or less to him and his Heirs forever

Secondly I give unto my Daughter Mary Salter Twenty Shillings

Thirdly I give unto my Grand Daughter Katharine Johnson one feather Bed and
Furniture on Chest and one Cow and Calf to be delivered her when she arrives
at the age of eighteen years but if she dies before Marriage or without lawful
issue then I give the articles given her to my Daughter Ann Timmons her heirs forever

Fourthly I give unto my wife Elizabeth Drewry the use of all the remainder of my land
and plantations whereon I now live also the use and labour of my Negro
Abel and Mill also the use of all the remainder of my estate of what
nature or kind so ever during her widowhood

Fifthly I give unto my Son James Drewry after the death or intermarriage
of my wife my Negro Boy Mill to him and his heirs forever

Sixthly I give unto my Son Humphrey Drewry after the death or inter
Marriage of my wife my Negro Boy Abel and to his heirs forever

Seventhly I give unto my Daughter Ann Timmons after the death or
intermarriage of my wife my Coach and all the Horses Vehicls
thence belonging also a new linen wheel and one woman
to be to her and her Heirs forever
