

Eighthly I give and bequeath to my Son Joseph Drury after the death or intermarriage of my wife all that part of my Land and plantations here given in also all the remainder of my Estate of what nature or kind I ever had before given away to him and his heirs forever but if my Son Joseph dies before he comes of age and without issue then I give the land and plantation given him to be equally divided between my Sons James and Humphrey or the heirs of their body and if either of my Sons first mentioned die without issue then I give the said land & plantation to the survivor of them and their heirs forever and in case of my Son Joseph's death before he comes to the age of twenty and I give all the remainder of my Estate given him be equally divided amongst all my Children and Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my Sons Samuel Drury and my Son in law Iphigley Simmons whole and sole Executors of this my last will Testament directing no appraisement of my Estate and I further desire my Son Samuel to take under his immediate care the Guardianship of Jon Joseph and that he will take care he may be educated in a manner suitable to his station in life In witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this fourth day of February 1789.
