of sound memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament
in manner following that is to say

I give and bequeath to my Grandson William Evans and Care to him
and his heirs forever

I give and Bequeath to my Grand Daughter Hannah Thompson
Evans one Pair and a large Prayer Book to her her heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my Grandson Benj^l Mosely Evans one Case
to him and his heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my Daughters Mary Pope and Martha
Pope all my Clothes of all kinds and all my Glass ware to be
equally divided between them

My Desire is that all the remainder of my Estate of what kind soever
be sold to the highest bidder for twelve months Credit and the
money arising therefrom to be equally divided between my two
Daughters aforesaid Mary Pope and Martha Pope and my
Grandson Benjamin Mosely Evans to them and their heirs forever

Lastly I appoint In^r T. Blow Esq^r of this my last will and testament I desire
that he may have full power to have this my last Will strictly complied
with according to the true sense and meaning thereof without having
it proved in Court and desire that my Children and Grand Children
may all agree thereto In witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and Seal this Twenty seventh Day of June 1788
