 This my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows (to wit)
 I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Rose the sum of Five Shillings
 I give and bequeath to my Daughter Martha Bennet the sum of Twenty Shillings
 I give and bequeath to my Daughter Holland Lewis the sum of Five Shillings
 I give and bequeath to my Five Sons (namely) William Bennet Samuel
 Bennet, Moses Bennet, Lemuel Bennet and Elias Bennet the
 plantation whereon I now live with all the Land thereunto belonging contain-
 ing by estimation 250 Acres to them and their Heirs forever
 I give to my aforesaid five sons and my Daughter Rebecca Bennet in equal
 portions all the residual and remainder of my Estate of every kind to them
 and their Heirs forever
 I do hereby constitute and appoint my Friend Edmund Johnson and my
 son William Bennet Executors to this my last Will and testament
 In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal
