of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia being sick and weak of body but of sound  
and disposing mind and memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same do make and constitute  
this my last Will and testament in form and manner following to wit: -

I have my Sorrell horse and Colt and one steer to be sold and the money to be applied  
to the payment of my debts and if any balance remain to be left in the hands of my wife  
Amey to be applied to her own use -

As to the remainder of my estate real and personal I lend the use thereof to my  
loving wife Amey during her natural life or widowhood and after her decease  
or marriage which ever may first happen I give and bequeath the same to be equally  
divided betwixt my son Kinchin Martin and Daughter Lucy Gurley and  
their heirs forever -

Lastly I do appoint my loving wife Amey and my son in law George Gurley  
Executors and executor of this my last Will and Testament ratifying  
this and no other to be my last Will and testament Given under my  
hand and Seal this 18<sup>th</sup> day of October 1791 -
