I give and bequeath unto my other child unborn five hundred pounds cash if there is more of my Estate after paying any Just Debts it is to be equally divided between my children John Turner Elizabeth Bittle Benjamin Turner my child unborn my wife and children and to have the use of the mill ten Years and after ten Years Equally to be divided between my Sons John Turner and Benjamin Turner my wifes whole Estate she is to receive again that she brought with her I lend her the use of my land and mill the South side of the great Branch the term of ten Years the Store of William Turner in Northampton North State and Henry Turner in Company is to go on if he chooses and my Son John Turner is to live with William Turner untill he comes to the age of twenty one years old my goods in my Store in Northampton I give unto my son John Turner and to continue in trade untill he comes to the age of twenty one Years my Stock of Cattle and Hogs are to be sold and equally divided between my four Children my Horses and Waggon must continue in the employ of my stores if the Waggoner Employed chooses to drive them the term of one year, Johns Cattle I give and bequeath unto John Turner, I give unto my wife my house named Eleanor Hall my small bay mare to be sold my stock of Sheep to be sold I give and bequeath unto my Son Benjamin Turner the Lot I own in Princetown and Millicorn Turner may be at his own option whether he will come in hear with his Store or not and have the ~~use~~ of this place without Rent or continue where he is when he collects Johns money if he thinks he is to work to trade he must draw out two hundred pounds out of Johns Estate all my personal articles are to be sold and the money Equally divided Between my children before named John Turner Elizabeth Bittle Benjamin Turner and my child unborn if my Daughter Elizabeth Bittle should die before she comes to the age of twenty one Year, and does not marry before that time her
