I hereby constitute and appoint my loving wife Lucy Williamson my son in law Joseph Jordan my daughter Nancy Williamson and my friend Samuel Kells Executors of this my last will & Testament revoking & making void all & every other Will heretofore by me made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & fixed myself this 22nd day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety two
