In the Name of God Amen I Arthur Iyner of the County of Southampton and parish of Nettonway being weak in body but of perfect sound sense & memory thanks be to almighty god for the same as touching such Temporal estate goods and Chattels as it hath been pleased god to bestow on me I give and devise in manner & form following—

I give & bequeath to my son Robert Iyner for shillings—
2^d I give and bequeath to my Son's Heir &c. Theophilus Iyner my horse two cows & calves and all my stock of Hogs also one feather bed and furniture to each of them but in case my son Theophilus Iyner should die without his lawfully begotten of his own body then legacy to my my son Thos. Iyner & his heirs—

Lastly I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Green Iyner one feather bed one chest & one spinning wheel the said Mary to have the first choice of my beds & furniture to her & to her heirs forever also my Loom & Cur
Fourthly and Lastly

All the remainder of my estate not yet disposed of of any kind whatsoever to be equally divided between my three children Thos. Theophilus & Mary Iyner to them to their heirs & assigns forever & I do hereby constitute appoint & ordain my friends John Davis & Burwell Rawlings whole & sole Executors of this my last will & Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 20th day of September 1792—

At a court continued and held for the county of Southampton the 11th day of January 1798 This Will was presented in Court by Burwell Rawlings one of the Executors therein named proved by the oath of John Smith one of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded And on the motion of the said executors who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form giving security Whimston &c.
