Item

I give & bequeath to my son Joshua Thorpe the above mentioned land & plantation after the death of my beloved wife & Martha Thorpe also two of the above mentioned stock of cattle or two of their increase one feather bed & furniture & my still to him & his heirs forever.

Item

I give & bequeath to my son Timothy Thorpe one tract or parcel of land lying on Tar river in the state of North Carolina near Tintle bridge containing six hundred & forty acres be the same more or less to him & his heirs forever but if the said Timothy Thorpe should die without his lawfully begotten issue said land & plantation to my son Willie Thorpe to him & his heirs forever but I except one third of this² land & plantation which I leave to the said Timothy Thorpe's widow during her natural life & after her death this² land shall return to this² Willie Thorpe as above mentioned.

Item

I give & bequeath to my son Harry Thorpe the whole of my land lying on the south side of the road leading from St. Crampton Court house to Hillsboro except one acre to him & his heirs forever but if he should die without his lawfully begotten I give this² land to my son Joshua Thorpe to him & his heirs forever also one bed and furniture.

I give and bequeath to daughter Sarah Clark one negro boy named Harry to her and her heirs forever

I give & bequeath to my three grand children orphans of Messy Spence due twelve pounds each current money of Virginia & the money to be put to interest by my executors until the eldest son arrives to the age of twenty years then I desire that the principal & interest be equally divided
