Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Lucy Long five shillings current money of Virg^a also one bed & furniture which she has already in possession to her & her heirs forever. I also give her one acre of land during her natural life, on the E^t side of the above mentioned road adjoining Hardy Thorpe land and after her death, I give the s^d acre of land to my son Hardy Thorpe to him & his heirs forever but if he should die without his lawfully begotten I give the s^d acre of land to my son Joshua Thorpe to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Olive Thorpe one negro girl named Phillis with her increase & one Feather bed & furniture & one women's saddle to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my grand daughter Polly Long the first child of the increase of my negro girl Rebecca if she should have any increase, & one feather bed & furniture & one loom to her & her heirs forever, but if she should die without heirs or under the age of eighteen years I give the s^d negro to my grand daughter Martha Long to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Martha Long one negro girl named Rebecca and all her increase except the eldest child which is above mentioned to her & her heirs forever but if she should die without her lawfully begotten or under the age of eighteen years, I give the s^d negro & her increase to my grand daughter Polly Long to her & her heirs forever, but if they should die without her lawfully begotten or under the age of eighteen years, I desire that the s^d negro girl & all her increase should be sold & the money arising, to be divided equally between the whole of my children to them & their heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Willie Thorpe one hundred pounds current money of Virginia to be made out of my estate & one bed & furniture to him and his heirs forever

My will & desire is that the whole of my estate that is not herein mentioned should be sold at public sale & one hundred pounds to be paid to my son Willie Thorpe as above mentioned and to pay of my just debts and funeral expenses & the balance if any, to be equally divided between my four children (to wit) Timothy Thorpe Hardy Thorpe Willie Thorpe and Olive Thorpe to them and their heirs forever
