and state of Virg^a being in perfect health & of a disposing mind & memory
but remembering the mortality of my body & that it is appointed for all men
once to die I do make this my last will & testament & with what worldly
goods god has been pleased to endow me with I give & dispose of in manner

Item I give & bequeath to my son John Gilliam the Land & plantation whereon
he now lives to a certain dividing line with all the lands contained therein
in to him his heirs & assigns forever

Item I release to my daughter in law Penelope Gilliam ^{one half} the remaining part of my land
her natural life the other half I give to & bequeath to my grandson Jⁿ Gilliam
son of Joseph Gilliam to be his at the age of eighteen years with
one half the profit of the orchard & at the death of his mother the whole of
my lands undisturbed of & to the said dividing line to him &
his heirs and assigns forever
