7th I Give to four young Negros now under my care namely Ellie, George, Cala & Charlotte each 20/-

8th My will & desire is that all my the remainder of my Estate may be equally divided amongst Thomas, Robert, Richard, Joseph, Mary, Millicent & Ann Hicks children of my brother Robert Hicks and Elizabeth Bailey & Sarah Bailey daughters of my Sister Elizabeth Scott deceased.

I constitute and appoint my Nephew Robert Hicks my whole and sole Executrix to this my last will and testament In Wilmesswhere I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 28 day of July 1792.

Thomas Petellow I do make & hold for the sum of £100 the 12 day of Decr 1793 This will was presented in court by Robert Hicks the Executrix herein named being one of Thomas Taylor (the People call'd Quakers) And prov'd by the solemn affirmation of Thomas Petellow another of the People call'd Quakers And ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said Executor who made affirmation according to Law certificate is granted him for obtain a probat whereof due form giving security whereupon he

with full and weak of body but of sound disposing mind & memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same
and calling to mind the uncertainty of this life and knowing that it is appointed once for allments
to die do make and ordain this my last will & testament in manner following First Principally I
recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God & my body to the Ground from whence it was
taken, hoping at the last day to receive that blessed sentence, come ye blessed children of my
father Inherit the Kingdom prepar'd for you before the beginning. And also what worldly
estate it hath pleased God to bestow on me I give and bequeath in manner following vizt

I give and bequeath unto my son James Gardner Jnl^d Ninety seven acres of woodland being part of a
Survey executed by myself and James Daughtry, deed bounded by the land of Ed^r Bay^t Baker
Matthew Gardner. The county line his own Land that he bought of John Daughtry to him
his heirs and assigns forever.... Item I give and bequeath unto three of my grandchildren
sons of my son James Gardner a tract to wit, Ioseph David & John the land & plantation that I bought of
Ed^r Sharp containing three hundred acres adjoining the land I now live on Nicholas Col^t the
tract that I give my son Ioseph Gardner lying by a dividing line made between him & this
tract by myself & Nicholas Col^t to them their heirs and assigns forever equally - Item I give
and bequeath unto my son Ioseph Gardner the land and plantation he now lives on bounded
by a dividing line between this tract and the tract given to my Grand Children, Rob^t Gardiner
and the county line. Hence by that line to the Cedar Swamp thence up the same to the
afores^d dividing line to the beginning containing three hundred acres the residue to sharp
also one hundred & twenty five acres bought Land purchased of Mr Sharp agreeable to a patent
Granted Rob^t Bryant call'd & known by the name of Galloway to him his heirs & assigns forever
