In the name of God Amen I Moses Booth of the Parish of Mottoway County South Carolina do make & ordain this to be my last will & Testament -
First it is my desire that my just debts & funeral expenses should be paid & in
the sale of the land which may be made on my plantation this present year -
Secondly I bequeath to my loving wife Dinna Booth the use of the plantation on which I now live & also a part of all the personal property of which I am possessed & I have here also the use of the following Negroes viz Peter Isaac Hannah Molly Ephraim Gilbert during their lives & I bequeath to my son Peter Booth the purchase of Benjamin Phillips or the North side of the Lightwood Swamp containing by estimation Two hundred acres also a tract of land on the afore said Swamp which I purchased of Phillips Booth also one small tract of land adjacent which I purchased of Henry Blaw containing forty five & a half acres to him & I bequeath to my aforementioned son Peter the following Negroes old Harry Sam John Henry Daniel Beck Mary Lucy Betty & Dillo and also one third part of my personal estate to him & his heirs Thirdly I bequeath to my son John Booth Two hundred & twenty Two acres of land which I purchased of Moses Booth also the plantation on which I now live after the marriage or decease of my wife I also bequeath to my said son John Booth the following Negroes Roger Ben, Rake, the Lydia, Joseph & Benjamin & young Jenny also one third part of my personal estate to him & his heirs Fourthly I bequeath to my daughter Martha Watson the following Negroes Pleasant & her children Tom, Sarah, Dick & Mary & with the future increase of the said Negro woman Pleasant to my daughter
