Wife In the name of God Amen Catharine Ramsay of Southampton county in Virginia being in perfect sense and memory thanks be to God for it but very weak in body do cattle mind that is appointed for all persons once to die and after that the Judgment I do make this my last will & Testament in manner I am as followeth, And first I would say, I do recommend my soul to Almighty God that gave it, And Secondly my body to be decently Buried at the hand of my Executors hereafter named For such worldly Estate as it hath, please God to bless me with I as follows

Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved son James Ramsay all my Plantation utensils the working tools one cart & wheel & four one great bill & flying pann & one small saw this choice my bow & half and one keise big with calf one Saw & six & all the corn that the Bacon & half the hogfat and the flax wheel & shackle and the stand of Bees & all money due me when collected

Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved daughter Lydia Ramsay one grey horse head & saddle one feather bed & furniture all my Pewter plates one basin & one dish one case of knives & forks one Loom & these & two necessary Tools

Item I give to my beloved daughter Mary Morgan one feather bed & furniture

Item I give to my beloved grandson James Ramsay Westbrook one feather bed & furniture

Item I give to my beloved grandson Arthur Westbrook four head of Sheep

Item I give to my beloved gran daughter Fanny Westbrook one cow & half & one 700 Ploy

Item I give to my beloved Temperance Moore one feather bed & furniture

Now it my will and desire that all the rest of my Estate be sold consisting of place and hog Land two head of cattle & eleven head of hogs three woolen wheels to & cotton cards and Pewter & crockery ware and all the rest of my Estate of all things & the money arising from it to be equally divided Between my six children Henry Ramsay James Ramsay Lydia Ramsay Mary Morgan Catharine Westbrook Temperance Moore I do thus ordain this & no other to be my last will & Testament & I do appoint my son James Ramsay to be my sole & sole Executor of my said bequest & delivered in presence of the witnesses this 8th day of March 1794
