In the Name of God Amen William Thomas of the parish of St Luke County of Southampton being of sound & disposing mind & memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same do make & constitute this my last will & Testament in form & manner following that is to say.

I Give and bequeath unto my son Henry the land & plantation wherein I now live to him & his heirs forever bounded on the south by a line of marked trees newly made beginning at a pine in the East side of Togethat hunta swamp near William's Cropping thence by a line of marked trees Eastward to the cleared ground wherein I now live thence by the said cleared ground a direct course to a Gum near Stokes spring thence by a line dividing my plantation called Sarah Carters to a small pine near the head of a small branch thence an easterly course across a point of wood to the head of another small branch thence down the run of the said branch to the old Patents line thence by the old Patents line to the Beginning —

My wife further is that my son Henry pay my son William the sum of ten pounds at his arriving at the age of twenty one years & also ten pounds yearly for two years after; And also that he pay my son John the sum of ten pounds at his arriving at the age of twenty one years; And also the yearly sum of ten pounds for two years after; and that he pay my daughter Lucy sum of ten pounds ten Shillings on her arriving at the age of Twenty one years on marriage and also the like sum of sum of ten Shillings the ensuing year all which my said son Henry is to advance out of the Estate freely to him given and further that my said son Henry support & maintain my sister Elizabeth during her life out of her Estate by accounting for the profits thereof agreeable to the will of my said Father.

I Give & bequeath to my son William & his heirs forever a Tract or Tenement of land containing by Estimation 350 Acres more or less & bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a line
