

A court held in the county of Southampton on the 12 day of February 1795 The last will and Testament of Elizabeth Blunt died, proved by the oath of Benjamin Blunt one of the witnesses thereto who also deposed that he saw Geo Blunt another witness thereto who is since dead subscribe his name as such & ordered to be recorded, there being allowed the Executor to qualify)

Blunt Geo. In the Name of God Amen I George Blunt being in my perfect mind & memory do make & ordain this my last will & Testament in manner & form as followeth 1794
 I Give and bequeath unto my father Benjamin Blunt & his heirs forever the land and plantation whereon I formerly lived also all my Tens stock of all kind and together with all and every part of my estate of what nature or kind soever I desire that my estate may not be appraised
 I do appoint my father Benj^r Blunt Executor of this my last will & Testament revoking all other wills by me heretofore made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 2nd day of December 1794.

Appelwhite Ann In the name of God Amen I Ann Appelwhite being weak of body but of sound mind do make & ordain this to be my last Will & Testament to wit
 I Give unto my son William Appelwhite my three Slaves George Will & Hadid with my son Thomas Appelwhite arrives to the age of Twenty one years at which time or Period I Give and devise the aforesaid Slaves to my said son Tho Appelwhite to him & his heirs forever provided he the said Thomas does faithfully and punctually pay within twelve Months after his arrival to the aforesaid age of twenty one the sum of One hundred Pounds which said money I intend to be divided into five Equal parts & Give to my daughter Mary Barham twenty pounds to my three sons John Hardy & William Appelwhite twenty pounds each
