In the name of God Amen I Jacob Summerrell of Hen County being of sound mind and disposing mind I hereby declare to Almighty God for the same to make the same my last will Testament in manner & form following (to wit) I give & bequeath unto my daughter Barbary Delbach one bed & furniture which she should receive by will my daughter Margaret Summerrell one bed & furniture I give & bequeath unto my son Harwell Summerrell one bed & furniture I give & bequeath unto my son Sam Summerrell one Negro girl named a black after the death or marriage of my said Sam Summerrell with her increase from this day forward, I give and bequeath unto daughter Sally part to her then heirs forever, I also give unto my two children Sam M Summerrell & Sally Summerrell one feather bed each to them & their heirs forever my will & desire is that my son Samuel M Summerrell & daughter Sally Summerrell equally partake my other three children the sum of five pounds as a price at the time that my son Sam M Summerrell shall arrive to the age of Twenty one years or should he die before he arrives to that age for the money to be paid at the time when he might have arrived to that age had he lived my will & desire is that after the death of my wife Lucy that the remaining part of all my estate not before given be equally divided Between my four
