 Charles, Janny, Grape, Abel, Hannah, Lucy, and Pleasant likewise all the
 the residue of my Estate Individually.

My will and desire is that after the death of my dear Mother that all the
 above mention'd property consisting of slaves and residue of my estate to fall with
 their increase and improvement should be immediately divided unto John Wesley Turner
 as his proper right and title, and should the said John Wesley Turner
 die under age and without lawful Issue of his body then my wife & mine
 is that the said mention'd slaves and residue of my estate with their proper
 increase and improvement should be equally divided between my wife
 and John Little to their & their heirs & assigns forever.

I do hereby appoint my friend Lewis Dupree as my whole & sole executor to
 this my last will & Testament In Witness whereof my hand I put this first
 day of April 1794.

 will was further proved by the oath of Cordale Francis another of the Justices
 and ordered to be recorded

 I Give unto Arthur Crumple all the remains of my whole estate and also
 and which the said Arthur Crumple & his heirs & assigns to have & to hold.
