In the name of God amen, I Stephen Johnston of the parish of St. Andrew and county of Southampton being weak of body but of a sound mind & memory do make and retain this my last will & testament and do dispose of my estate as follows -

- First, I give and bequeath unto my living wife Sarah Johnson all the remains of her estate that she brought into my estate, In and to the part that do and remain unto her & her heirs forever.
- Secondly, I leave the use of the following articles to my living wife Sarah Johnson my soul more & her increase Two first choice of my cows and Calf, one sow and piggs one side saddle, one loom and heare one flax wheel, nine hundred weight of pork made fat out of crop of pork and one third part of my Land I say I leave the use of the aforesaid articles unto her & her heirs for ever.
- Thirdly, I give and bequeath unto my son John Johnston ten pounds current
