

1st I Give and bequeath unto my son W^m Johnson Ten pounds current money of Virginia to him & his heirs forever.
 2^d I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Polly Johnston Ten pounds current money of Virginia to her and her heirs forever.
 3^d I Give & bequeath unto my son Joseph Johnson Ten pounds current money of Virginia to him & his heirs forever.
 4th I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sally Johnston Ten pounds current money of Virginia to her & her heirs forever.
 5th I Give & bequeath unto my son Stephen Johnson Ten pounds current money of Virginia to him & his heirs forever.

And lastly my will and desire is that my Executors do sell my land and ~~goods~~ and all the remainder of my estate of what nature or kind ^{soever} that has not being given in legacy and after paying my just debts and legacies the remainder to be equally divided between my children then living and likewise my will and desire is that my Executors do (after the death or marriage of my wife) divide the estate that I have left to her use between my children as aforesaid, I likewise do constitute and appoint my two sons Benjamin & Nathaniel Johnston Executors of this my last will and testament given under my hand and seal this 27th Day of September 1796.
