being weak in body tho' of sound mind disposing mind and memory willing to
prevent disputes in my family about my Estate after my Death do make this my
last Will and Testament in manner and form following, to wit, -

My will and wish is that all my Just^d debts be paid -
I give and bequeath unto my grand Daughter Patsy Milton daughter of
Ann Milton the tract and parcel of Land whereon I now live the unabated
right to be made her by M^r. Eli^h. Taylor in a deed which said Land I give to my
grand Child Patsy Milton and her heirs for ever -

Item

I give all the residue of my Estate both real and personal not heretofore bequeathed
to be equally divided between my three Children (to wit) Leah Milton, Randolph
Milton & Ann Milton which Estate I give to them and their heirs forever
And lastly I do appoint my friends M^r. Arthur Turner and M^r. Benjamin
Barham jr. Executors to this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all
other Wills by me heretofore made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand Vocal this first day of December one Thousand seven hundred and
eighty Eight
