part of my Estate of what nature or kind —— thereon, after my debts are
paid, and lastly I do constitute and appoint my said Brother Alfred
Howell Whole & Sole Executrix to this my last Will & Testament, In
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year
