

I give and devise unto my daughter Polly McKenny Brock one negro girl by the name of Nancy one bed and furniture one Pew and half one dish and three plates to her and her heirs forever —

I desire that one Negro woman named Lukey sh<sup>ld</sup> be sold (and all her increase from the date hereof) and the money arising, shall be equally divided between my two children (Twit) Thomas Ellis and Polly McKenny Brock to them and to their heirs forever —

I give and devise unto my grand daughter Susanna Willford four pounds Cash to her and her heirs forever — All the residue and remainder of my estate of what nature and kind soever after my just debts are paid I desire it should be equally divided between my wife and three children (to wit John Thomas Ellis and Polly McKenny Brock to them and their heirs forever —

I constitute & appoint Edward Bailey Solomon Holmes and my son Wm Brock my executors of this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this 8<sup>th</sup> day of February 1795

And at a court held for the county of Southampton the 15<sup>th</sup> day of January 1798 This Will was further proved by the oath of James Butts another witness and ordered to be recorded and on the the Motion of William Brock one of the Exors named in the will (the others refusing to take upon themselves the burden of the execution thereof who made oath according to Law anticipate is granted him for obtaining a habeas thereof in due form giving security whereupon
