Wills

In the Name of God Amen I Beasant Crumpler of the
parish of Millom and County Southhampton being sick and weak in body but of
a perfect sound mind and memory do make and ratify this my last Will and Testa-
ment In manner and form as followeth Viz - - - - -

I Give unto my son William Crumpler five Shillings -

I Give unto my son John Crumpler one Shilling Sterling -

I Give unto my son Beasant Crumpler my house and plantation whereon I now
live containing one hundred acres be the the same more or less Also one new bed-
bed & furniture one folding table, one large iron stove, one Whiffell together
with all the necessaries I have for saving fuel, All my copperas Tubs, one half-
cask cut Saw, one half of a Grindstone, Two Iron Steam Pipes, and the increase
thereof, one year's seed of Wheat, one black heifer, and the increase thereof
one street mare, one saddle & bridle, Two Guns, one Cart & wheels, one plough, four
Vehling Gies, Two Augers, Two Chisels, one hand Mill, one Harrow &c, one Green
Chast, Two plough hies, one scawing Dr, one greibing Dr, one five Quarts jug, one
half gallon water Jug, four Iron wages, three Chairs, 3 Lt Bottles, one clear half
pint Bottle, All these to him and his heirs forever -

I Give unto Allen Sells five Shillings -

I Give unto Ely Johnson five Shillings -

I Give unto my beloved wife Sarah Crumpler all the remains of my estate not
above mentioned During her life or Widowhood and at her death or marriage
it is my will and desire that it should be equally divided between my
three daughters namely Molly Jones, Betsy Crumpler & Sally
Crumpler to them and their heirs forever -

And Lastly I do appoint my son Beasant Crumpler and my friend Geo:
Crumpler to be my whole and sole Exors of this my last Will and Tes-
tament Making void all other will by me heretofore made In
Witness my hand Seal this 1st Day of October 1795 -
