 and his heirs for Ever, Containing by estimation one hundred Acres be the
 same more or less, and bounded as followeth (Viz.) beginning at in the
 mouth of a Branch in the little Swamp up the S^d Branch to a black
 Gum in Edmunds Barretts line thence a long S^d Barretts line to a
 pine a corner in Jacob Williams line thence a long S^d Williams line
 to a pine a corner in S^d Williams line thence a long the S^d Williams
 line to a lightwood Swamp, thence up the Run of the S^d Swamp to
 the Beginning, Also I give to my dear beloved wife, all my Stock of
 horses, Cattle, Sheep, & Hogs, also my house hold & Kitchen furniture
 all Tools of all kinds - Also I give to my dear beloved wife, the Tract of Land
 lying on the other side of the Branch joining the first Tract of Land
