head of cattle then increase one bay horse two feather bed
and furniture five chairs one spinning wheel two seat trunks one
looking glass five plates two dishes three basons half dozen cups one
pau hand shov one iron Pott rack one water pail and two barrels
be granted and given to the use of my said Daughter Sally Newson
during her life and then to be equally divided between Martha
Jellison and Elizabeth Newson to them and their heirs forever

My wish and desire that the goods and chattles heretofore lent
by me to Martha Taylor for her comfort be at her death equally
divided between my four grand daughters (to wit) Nancy, Sally,
Patsy, Mary, Lucy Taylor, to them and their heirs forever —

I Give to my grand daughter Nancy Taylor my desk and its contents
to her and her heirs forever —

Item

I give my trunk to Patsy G Newson to her and her heirs forever —

I give and bequeath my Seccle and cradle to Sally Taylor my
grand daughter The rest and residue of my estate not here
fore devised I will it after my Just debts & funeral expenses are
paid to be equally divided between my two Daughters Martha Taylor &
Sally Newson's Children — I do hereby revoke all former wills
& Testaments by me made & as herein this my last will and Testament
and do by these presents nominate & appoint my trusty friend John
Jones Executor to this my last, In Witness whereof I have caused
my hand & seal to be affixed this first day of June 1779 Eight
