

I give to my niece Elizabeth Person six Table & six Sea Horse spoons —
 I leave all my household furniture, and all my stock of horses, cattle, hogs & sheep
 and all the residue of my estate not heretofore mentioned to Henry Person to support and
 educate his lawless Children until the division of the negroes, then the remaining part of
 any to be sold and equally divided in the same manner as the Negroes —
 It is my desire that the five hundred Acres of Land more or less lying on the Angelica
 swamp shall be sold and equally divided among the aforesaid Legatees, as soon as my
 title is established —
 Finally I do hereby constitute and appoint Henry Person the whole & sole executor
 of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand and seal this last day of December one thousand seven hundred and ninety
 eight —

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 15th
 day of April 1799 — This Will was presented in

 to and read to be recorded — And on the Motion of the said Executor who made oath

In the name of God Amen, I Mary Pond, the eldest being of sound mind
 and memory do make and publish this my last Will and testament, here by revoking
 and annulling all other Wills heretofore by me made —
 First I desire that my daughter Mary Wood shall have my Chest, to whom I give it
 forever —
 Second, I give and bequeath to Mary Pond, (Wife of my Grandson John Pond jr.) my small
 bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever —
 Third I desire that all my other property, after my Just debts and Funeral Expenses
 are paid, shall be equally divided amongst my son John Pond my daughter Mary
 Wood and the Children of my deceased son Richard Pond, they the said Children of
 my son Rich^d. Collectively to have but one third. My son John & daughter
 Mary Wood the other two thirds of my Estate, on Condition however to my son
 John, that if he should bring any account or claim of any kind against me,
 In that case wiser, that he shall not have, enjoy or possess any part of my
 Estate, but that the whole, except what I have given to my daughter Mary
 & the wife of my grandson John, shall be equally divided between my daughter
 Mary Wood she to have one half and the Children of my dec^d son Rich^d.
 Collectively (they to have the other half) to whom I give it forever —
