In the Name of God Amen I Nicholas Morris Senr. of Southampton County being of Sound Mind and memory do make againe hereby my last Will and Testament as follows —
 I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Diacy Booth fifteen Shillings —
 I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Penn fifteen Shillings —
 I give unto Elizabeth^W which hath lived with and kept my house twenty four Shillings —
 I give and bequeath unto my Son John Morris and his heirs forever all the Lands and plantation that I am possessed with containing by Estimation one hundred acres and after all my Just debts and Legacies are paid. I give unto him all the remainder of my Estate of what nature or kind soever and do constitute and appoint him the said John Morris my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament — Given under my hand and Seal this twenty first day of

June 1799
