County of Southampton, be at this time weak and infirm yet of sound Mind, do make and
constitute his Writing as and for my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all
former Wills or Dispositions heretofore by me made.

First, I recommend my soul to Almighty God, fully trusting by the mediation of
his universal Saviour that it will be received into his Mansions of everlasting Bliss
My mortal Body must be committed to the Grave in such sort as my Executors in
their discretion shall direct; My worldly Possessions with God hath blessed my
Industry, I give and dispose of hereafter particularly mention'd

Item, I give to my son William Stephenson ten Shillings Cash to be raised and paid to
him by my Executors to him for ever

Item, I give to my Daughter Sally Stephenson one Feather Bedstead and furniture, also the
choice of one Cow and one Lamb of one Cow to her at her disposal for ever

Item, I give to my Daughter Dicky Stephenson one Feather Bedstead and
furniture, one Cow to her at her disposal for ever

Item, I give to my son Charles Stephenson, one Feather Bedstead and furniture
one Cow to him at his own disposal for ever

Item, I give to my son Samuel Stephenson a parcel of new feathers, one Spotted
Blanket, one Linen Cove & one Sheet, also two Yearlings (the best choice) to him at
his own disposal for ever

Lastly, my will and desire is, that residue of my Estate after paying my son
William Stephenson the above mentioned ten Shillings and no more, shall be Equally
divided between my four Children, namely, Sally Stephenson, Dicky Stephenson,
Charles Stephenson, and Samuel Stephenson to be divided between them as they
think most proper

My will and desire is that my son Charles Stephenson shall take it upon himself and
act as sole Executor to this my last Will and Testament, In Witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal to this my last writing in the Year of our Lord
One thousand seven hundred and seventy Nine
